English	 Listen to and innovate on a familiar imaginative story to create a new story for a favourite character. Produce a sample of writing independently. Writing – sentence structure Reading – segmenting and blending sounds to read short words/texts Phonics – (whole alphabet, oo, oo, ee, qu, and exploring other long vowel sounds) Phonological awareness 	 Students will participate in Heggerty's program, listen to and respond to letter patterns and rhyme.
