INTRUMENTAL MUSIC - INTRUMENTAL MUSIC RECRUITMENT INFORMATION

Annually students are offered the opportunity to join the Instrumental Music Program. The Instrumental Music Program is a cocurricular activity that includes a weekly before or after school band rehearsal and a half hour small group lesson during the school day. Throughout the year band members undertake school performances, competitions, concerts, workshops and camps.

Students learn about the instruments and the sounds they make during classroom music lessons. Students wanting to apply to join the Instrumental Music Program have to choose an instrument that they would like to learn to play and should think seriously about which instrument would be best for them.

Attached to this notice is a preference form that needs to be completed and returned. Before completing this preference form you need to consider the following conditions:

- Participating in the Instrumental Music Program is a huge commitment for students and parents.
- Students must undertake a minimum of one year in the program.
- There are a limited number of instruments available for hire from the school and you have a greater chance of your child participating in the program if you are able to purchase an instrument.
- In order to recruit a balanced band, there are limited places available on some instruments.
- There is a cost associated with the Instrumental Music Program. You either provide your own instrument or apply to hire one from the school for 12 months.
- The program includes an Instrumental Music Student Resource Scheme which has an annual fee to cover the cost of maintaining the Music Library for your child; upgrading accessories and equipment such as music stands, photocopying expenses, purchasing of awards, certificates, prizes, costs associated with the Eisteddfod / Fanfare (entry fees, buses), maintenance of Music Uniforms and accompanist fees.


