Classroom Connections

Welcome back to all of our students and families for Term 3! We have had a great start to the term and it has been a pleasure to see the children after a well-earned rest from a very busy Term 2. Please take some time to read about what we have happening in our class in the coming term.

ENGLISH

In English this term, students will construct retells from familiar stories. They will listen to, read, view and interpret spoken and written texts. The children will write a retell using the correct structure taught to them during the term. When reading at home, it would be beneficial to encourage your child to retell their stories, making sure they can sequence the story's events in the correct order. Later in the term, students will begin to explore procedures. Throughout the term, we will continue to focus on sounding out words, editing our own work and reading over our writing to check for meaning.

MATHEMATICS

In Mathematics this term, we will be describing number patterns, representing and recording two-digit numbers, partitioning 2-digit numbers and continuing to learn different addition and subtraction strategies. In measurement, students will be comparing different lengths, measuring different objects and ordering objects based on length. In Shape, students will be describing the features of the different 2D and 3D shapes. We will also continue exploring o'clock times, half past times and the value of different coins.

SCIENCE

In this unit, students will describe the features of a variety of types of landscapes and skies. They will focus on drawing and describing the night sky and the day sky. The students will consider how the changes between day and night impact on them and other living things.

GEOGRAPHY

In this unit, students will explore how spaces within a place can be rearranged to suit different purposes. They will examine and record the differences between the natural, managed and constructed features of an environment. Students will investigate the use of pictorial maps and describe the position of features using directional language.

ART

In this unit we will be studying colour and Line.

TECHNOLOGY/ICT

Technology is building a landscape diorama. If you could start to collect empty shoe boxes and multi pack chip boxes (see image below). More information to follow.
